The Scottish Futures Trust has managed the Scottish Government's £1.8bn Scotland's Schools for the Future programme since it was launched in 2009. By August 2020, 117 new or refurbished schools will have been delivered right across Scotland.

With all schools in the current programme now open or in construction, and in anticipation of the publication of a new Learning Estate Strategy from Scottish Government, now is a great time to reflect on what the projects have achieved in relation to design, use of space and the many different approaches being adopted to teaching and learning.
